ITINERARY:

DAY 1	Arrive San Jose Welcome to Costa Rica! Learn the secrets of Pura Vida – Costa Rica's inimitable zest for life that will linger throughout your trip. This evening, we'll join our Travel Director for a Welcome Reception.	
DAY 2	Braulio Carrillo National Park & Tortuguero National Park Journey to San Isidro de Heredia, where we'll 'Dive into Culture' with master chocolatiers, Julio Fernandez and George Soriano, to learn about the history of chocolate and how it is produced at this small workshop. Then, it's on to Siquirres where we'll embark on a river journey through protected wetlands to secluded Tortuguero. Immerse yourself in its vibrant Afro-Caribbean atmosphere as you stroll through the village streets. We enjoy dinner at our hotel this evening accompanied by the enchanting sounds of resident cicadas and tree frogs. (B, L, D)	
DAY 3	Tortuguero National Park Sightseeing Cruise the canals and streams of the park today with a Local Specialist as howler monkeys watch from the treetops, toucans and egrets fly through the air and crocodiles ply the cool waters. Visit the Village of Tortuguero to shop or explore. (B, L, D)	
DAY 4	Tortuguero to Sarapiquí Bid adiós to Tortuguero and head back to the mainland where we'll enjoy lunch before meeting the Tico family for a 'Dive into Culture' experience at their palm plantation. There we'll learn about and sample the delicate heart of palm. Tonight, we'll enjoy a 'Be My Guest' experience with the owners of our hotel, providing a 'Connect with Locals' experience, as they prepare a special BBQ meal just for us. (B, L, D)	
DAY 5	Sarapiquí to Arenal Rise with the sun to get up close and personal with Costa Rica's exquisite nature during a leisurely hike. Keep a look out for the endangered great green macaw and connect with the beautiful natural surroundings. Embark on an optional White-Water Rafting experience later this morning. We 'Connect with Locals' this afternoon, enjoying a 'Be My Guest' lunch at an eco-friendly hacienda built by the Quintana family as a retirement project. Today, it is home to an organic farm and related ecoadventures. 'Make a Difference' and learn how our visit contributes to the local community. Our journey continues to Arenal Volcano, on whose slopes we spend the afternoon relaxing in our resort's beautifully landscaped thermal pools. (B, L)	
DAY 6	Arenal to Monteverde Cloud Forest Our soul-stirring encounter with Costa Rica's natural wonders continues after a morning at leisure. Straddle the Continental Divide and touch the sky in Monteverde Cloud Forest, where we'll have an opportunity to explore this biodiverse sanctuary, renowned for its collection of orchid species - more than in any other single place. Tonight, we'll meet a native Quaker, and Local Specialist, who will share stories of Old Town Monteverde and delve into the history of the American Quakers who settled in the area in the 1950s. This evening, relish some of the best views as we enjoy dinner. (B, D)	
DAY 7	Monteverde Cloud Forest Sightseeing This morning, we'll join our guide for an excursion through the lush rainforests of Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve. We ascend to the treetops high above the jungle floor below, treading lightly along the Sky Walk suspension bridges amongst the wildlife that find sanctuary in the boughs of the surrounding canopy. As our epic ecoadventure nears its end, we share stories with newfound friends at a Farewell Dinner before heading to the coast tomorrow. (B, D)	
DAY 8	Monteverde to Guanacaste We'll check in to our seaside resort today for some time to relax. With just a short stroll along the shore, we can spot a variety of wildlife. (B)	
DAY 9	Guanacaste Free Time The day is ours to further relax at the beach, head into nearby Tamarindo village, or choose from numerous options to continue our Costa Rica adventure as we please. (B)	
DAY 10	Return Home After breakfast we'll transfer to Liberia International Airport for our return flight home. (B)

- 1 = Easy Very leisurely pace, minimal physical activity, stepping on and off the coach, and shorter touring days
- 2 = Moderately Easy Easy pace, some stairs and standing, three to four blocks of walking at a time on level terrains
- 3 = Active Moderate pace, good mobility needed, stairs and prolonged standing, includes city walking tours, some shorter and some longer days
- 4 = Moderately Challenging Fast pace, some strenuous activities, walking on varied terrain and up to two miles at a time
- 5 = Challenging Vigorous pace, frequent strenuous activities, extensive walking and longer touring days
